## **PREAMBLE**

Chandigarh – the most daring experiment in modern urbanism has just become the Mecca of architects from all over the world. Chandigarh's pre-eminence as an 'International City' rests largely on the world renowned architect – Le Corbusier who developed the master plan in 1951, based on his urban planning theories and the masterly architectural works. What is not so well-known is the fact that the 20<sup>th</sup> century's greatest architect succeeded in getting Chandigarh College of Architecture as an integral part of great Chandigarh Experiment. His conviction was that the creation of built environment, however brilliant and consequential cannot be fully grasped – much less perpetuated – if the principles regulating the concept are not properly understood through study of various components of the city in use. The raison d'être of CCA demands that this unique institution should develop its native potential and the ability to inspire, support, sustain and continue academic programmes whereby professionals trained in the tradition of modern urbanism could be enabled to extend the frontiers of creativity – efficiently, comprehensively and beautifully.

## **INCEPTION/ BRIEF HISTORY**

Chandigarh College of Architecture was established on 7 August 1961 as a part of the great "Chandigarh Experiment" to impart education in Architecture. The college conducts a 5-year Course consisting of 10-Semesters leading to the degree of Bachelor of Architecture (B.Arch) for which it is affiliated to the Panjab University in the Faculty of Design and Fine Arts. CCA is a premier architectural institution of the entire North-Western region covering the States of Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Rajasthan as well as the Union Territory of Chandigarh. A large number of the alumni of this college are now doing extremely well professionally whether it be in practice, the government and public sector undertakings, teaching or research. The college is located in the educational zone of the city next to the Punjab Engineering College in Sector 12.

## **ACADEMIC IDEOLOGY AND BROAD OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE**

We believe that architecture, the Great Mother Art, is an ambient social art and it seeks to render comprehensive service to mankind by meeting the complex challenges of contemporary life.

In the light of the profession's new role we train our students by exposing them to live problems, situations and disciplinary approach which is addition to classroom learning through lectures, slide-talks, discussions, assignments, comprehension tests, etc. entails numerous site visits and on-the-spot studies. Students are encouraged to make their own observations of the facts to analyse and to evaluate them so that they may learn to reckon the relevance and applicability of

investigative studies to the programme requirements of creative coursework in architectural design. The major objective of our B. Architecture Course is to train professionals capable of working efficiently both in the practical field as well as in the academic and research environment. With various subjects, the course structure enables development of creative thinking and skills, familiarization with evolution and philosophy of architecture as well as theoretical and practical knowledge of the technical and constructional aspects of building. The large number of elective introduced in 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> year of the course help to create awareness of the numerous areas and opportunities for diversification/ specialization after completing the under graduate course.

The college has a well-qualified and experienced faculty duly reinforced by visiting faculty of eminent professional drawn from the field in the disciplines of architecture, planning, urban design, engineering, humanities etc.

### **COURSES STRUCTURE**

The B. Architecture is programmed to give an all-round exposure, with subjects delineated in the four streams of Art, Humanities, Science and Technology. While the arts stream would train the students in creative thinking and skills through subjects such as Architectural Graphics, Architectural Drawing, etc. the humanities stream covering History of Built Environment, Vernacular Architecture, etc. would acquaint the student with the evolution and philosophy of architecture. Subjects in science and technology such as Building Technology, Structure Systems and Design, Building Construction, etc. are incorporated to give sound theoretical and practical knowledge of technical and constructional aspects of buildings. This is supplemented by practical application of the acquired theoretical and philosophical information through site visits, tours and practical work. The aim is to develop a holistic approach whereby a student can comprehend problems of architecture in totality of the societal and environmental context.

The Bachelor of Architecture programme has a two tier break-up with the first tier comprising of six semesters and second tier comprising of four semesters making it a ten-semester degree course. The first tier culminates in a degree titled "Bachelor of Building Science". The emphasis here is on giving adequate practice in the basic skills viz. Architectural drafting, technical detailing, graphics, structures and creative expression, culminating in Architectural Design. It is expected that a student on completion of this stage would be competent in assisting a qualified architect in running an architectural practice. It is also a foundation for the second tier leading to more advanced courses for the bachelor's Degree in Architecture. After the first tier, the student are required to undergo 24 weeks Practical Training in an established architectural firm to acquaint them with realities of the field. The course culminates in a research-

cum-design thesis in the tenth semester when students are required to undertake a topic/project of their choice, conduct research on its various aspects and apply the conclusions for evolving design solutions.

### **SPECIAL LECTURE, WORKSHOPS AND SEMINARS**

To support our academic programmes workshops, seminars and special lectures in various areas are organized from time to time by inviting eminent professionals in the respective field. An art studio has also been established under the supervision of Lecturer-in-Art. Besides this, the college has two regular annual events in the form of 'Archo' – a cultural week held in March every year and the 'Le Corbusier Day' in October every year dedicated to academic and professional introspection through seminars and lectures.

### **EDUCATIONAL TOURS**

Educational tours to different places of architectural interest are necessary for comprehensive architectural education. Tours and site visits are organized with a view to expose the students of India rich cultural heritage, besides giving them an opportunity to study examples of significant modern architecture at first hand.

### **ANNUAL INTAKE**

The annual intake of the students is restricted to 40 including 5 seats reserved for nominees of states deficient in architectural education. 85% of the remaining seats are reserved for candidates from the Union Territory of Chandigarh. The rest of the seats are for students appearing from instructions outside Chandigarh.

### **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

The admission to our B.Arch Degree course is made on the basis of All India Engineering/ Pharmacy/Architecture Entrance Examination conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi, comprising a scholastic proficiency test and an Architecture Aptitude Test. The test is usually held in the month of May every year. The candidate should be otherwise eligible and have essential qualifications prescribed for admission to the stated course although no weight age is given to the qualifying examination. The candidate must fulfill the following admission requirements:-

Be an Indian National

Have passed 10+2 examination or an equivalent recognized examination with Mathematics where after the candidate must clear both Entrance Examination and Architecture Aptitude Test individually.

### **FEE AND EXPANSE**

Admission fee including various funds are as under:-  
Day scholars : Rs.7500/- (approx.)

Hostellers : Rs.15000/- (approx.)

## **ACADEMIC INFRASTRUCTURE**

### **LIBRARY**

The College has a centrally air-conditioned library with approx. 16,000 titles in architecture and related fields. There is also an exclusive thesis section where all the 10<sup>th</sup> Semester thesis reports are kept for record and consultation. With time this section has developed into a major resource centre for architectural studies of the region. Teaching aids like audio and videocassettes are also available. Training reports of Seventh semester students are also available here for reference.

### **COMPUTER CENTRE**

There is a well equipped, air-conditioned Computer Center networked with a number of workstations supported by dot-matrix printers, laser printer, inkjet colour printers, scanners and plotter. It has 66 PCs along with latest CAD software like 3-D studio, Auto Architect Architectural Suit (NFR) Autocad-2004, Photoshop Version 7.0, Corel Draw 10, A.D.T. 3.3, stellar. It also has a multi-media projector. As a result, students have been regularly presenting seminars and design proposals using the latest audio-visual presentation techniques. The faculty has a separate computer lab with the latest infrastructure and round the clock Internet access, which helps in constant updating of information and enhancing the knowledge bank. Besides this each faculty member has been provided personal computer.

### **WORKSHOP**

The college workshop caters to the need of 'hands on' experience in handling of building construction tools and model making. It has facilities including machines and trained personnel in the fields of carpentry, metal work and model making.

### **MUSEUM**

The college museum houses samples of building materials, architectural products, structural system models, various kinds of trusses, joinery details, metal doors and windows, etc. for ready reference and for use as teaching aids.

### **AUDIO-VISUAL SECTION**

The audio-visual section has four overhead projectors, seven slide projectors, one video projector, one VCR, 3 nos. slide viewers, 1 coloured T.V., one Sony Stereo System with Cassette and VCD player, one Kodak public address system, as well as stage lighting equipment, along with "Hotline 203

Projectavision" (with big screen) for screening educational films for students. Audio-visual lectures are delivered by professors to complement class room teaching.

### **PHOTOGRAPHIC LABORATORY**

The photographic laboratory has been equipped with darkroom facilities for B/W processing, five 35 mm(SLR) cameras a medium format camera, digital camera, computer, multimedia Projector, overhead Projector, Epidiascopes, scanner, printer, slide viewer, enlargers, and developing & printing gadgets.

### **RESEARCH, DESIGN & DEVELOPMENT CELL**

The cell has been engaged in the study and documentation of various aspects of the Chandigarh experiment. It also undertakes classification and compilation of research material based on the students' B.Arch. thesis, publication of College Newsletter and Research Journals, and research papers on architecture and allied disciplines. At present, two architects are working as Research Assistants in the Cell. The research cell is currently involved in the publication of the updated **Informograph** on Chandigarh and **Natural heritage- a history of Chandigarh**. The informograph is available with the college Store Keeper.

### **STUDENT – ARCHITECTS STORE (SAS)**

Stationery, drawing material and equipments are available to the students from the self-supporting shop with the college premises only.

### **EXCHANGE PROGRAMMES**

The college has student and faculty exchange programs with Nancy School of Architecture, France; E'cole d' Architecture de Paris, La, Defense, France; University of Leuven, Arenbergkesteel; Kard Mercierlaan, Belgium; Kamla Reheja School of Architecture, Mumbai, Many students from abroad have already carried out studies on Chandigarh in this college. The college has close liaison with other major schools of architecture in India and abroad.

### **SUPPORTING INFRASTRUCTURE**

#### **ASSEMBLY HALL & SEMINAR ROOM**

The Assembly Hall of 200 seats capacity has all modern facilities such as air conditioning, acoustic treatment and public address system and is frequently used for presentations, lectures and students' seminars. A well equipped air conditioned Seminar Room for holding meetings/conferences is also available.

#### **HOSTELS**

Adequate accommodation is available for both boys and girls in separate hostel buildings. The boys hostel, Corbu House with accommodation for 99 students is

located in the college campus while Architecture Girls Hostel with 100 rooms is located in Sector 11 B.

### **STUDENTS CENTRE**

Facilities for indoor games, recreation clubs, lounging, and canteen have been provided in this centre housed in an independent block next to the college building.

### **MEDICAL AID**

The students get adequate medical aid from the medical officer who has been engaged to look after this at the dispensary within the campus.

### **BANK AND POST OFFICE**

The facility of Bank (State Bank of India) and Post Office is available in the campus.

### **CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

#### **SPORTS AND GAMES**

The college provides for many sports facilities including Cricket, Basketball and Volleyball. It has a Physical Fitness Centre which has a Multi-Station Machine for all-round physical fitness exercises.

### **ASSOCIATION AND CLUBS**

Students body "Chandigarh Association of Student-Architects" (CASA) exists in the college to promote students welfare and co-curricular activities. CASA is affiliated to the National Association of Students of Architecture (NASA) which holds an annual convention comprising design and studio-work competitions, exhibitions, literary and cultural events. Due to the increase in the number of architectural institutions in the country, colleges have been classified into six zones which organize Zonal NASA convention in their respective zones.
